Dark clouds are rising in the sky. "We have to protect ourselves against the thunderstorm" he says to Flocke. "We are in danger!" Max feels like he is in an action movie and starts to run. "We have to escape!", he calls. But then,

the first raindrops fall and the rumbling of the thunder comes closer and closer. Now there's even lightning! Now Max gets afraid. Where can he find a safe place? Look, a tree standing over there! But then Max remembers: Lightning often strikes in high rising areas. So the tree is not a good place. He also must not go under a tree. What if he can't find shelter, soon? What if he is struck by lightning? "I don't want these adventures any more", he says to Flocke. The dog doesn't like the big rain drops at all. Suddenly he stops, right on the path and



shakes. "We have to go on!" calls Max and turns around towards him. Then he notices something between the trees. Isn't that a small cottage? He approaches carefully. "A log cabin!", he calls. There they will be safe. Max opens the door and sits down on a bench. "How good, that you stopped", he said to his dog, "otherwise I probably wouldn't have seen the cottage." Together they wait until the thunderstorm passed by. Max decides: Adventure movies are something for cinema. In real life, it's much better to be safe!



Tip: How to act in a thunderstorm

The interior of a car is a perfect shelter against lightning. Thus you should stay inside the car, when surprised by a thunderstorm. Even if the car is struck by lightning, it will not cause any harm to you, as the electricity is drained into the ground.

Do not use an umbrella in a thunderstorm. High rising objects are like antennas and attract lightning. Put the umbrella down on the ground, a couple of meters away from you. Never go swimming in a lake or swimmingpoolduringathunderstorm! Water is a perfect conductor. When there is lightning, get out of the water as fast as you can!

If you are surprised by a thunderstorm and there is a permanent building within your reach, go in. There you can find shelter and you are safe against lightning.

On the first day al-ready, he decides: "Mountains are the most beautiful thing on earth – when I'm grown up, I will become a mountaineer!" "Let's go, Flocke. We'll see where the eagle lives!", calls Max ex-cited. The two of them follow the bird as fast as they can – but then the eagle disappears behind a mountain. Where did we come from, left or right? "Flocke, we have a problem", ex-plains Max. By saying "eenie meenie miney mo" he decides for the left way and goes along. But then he can hear it, too: Dogs are barking loudly in the distance. Usually, there are no dogs out here – Max felt he needed to explore this! He pedals fast and very soon he reaches a field, where some rescue dogs are training today. Flocke is really excited when he sees the other dogs and he wags his tail showing how happy he is. He wants to go there! But Max keeps him back and together they watch, what is going on in the field.

A woman who is wearing a uniform opens a plastic bag and holds it in front of the muzzle of a shepherd dog. It has a short sniff and then pulls on his leash heavily. With its nose on the ground he pulls the women along next to the bushes and concrete blocks – then he stops in front of a wall and barks. And what is that? A man comes out from behind the wall! Satisfied he gives the dog a treat.

Afterwards the dog handlers sit with their rescue dogs and listen carefully as the trainer gives them a task. "Shush, Flocke", whispers Max, "we'll listen, too!" The trainer explains that dogs can track buried people, only by using their sense of smell. She gives them a training exercise: "Over there, in this heap of stones a man is buried under debris. Of course, he gets lots of praise for this!



"You see, dogs can save people's lives", explains the trainer to Max, who watches amazed.

Dogs at work

Our four-legged friends are deployed to save people in many different surroundings:

- Area search for missing, for example in large woods
- Debris search for people, who are buried by dest royed houses, for example after an earthquake
- Avalanche search for missing, who are covered by snow
- Water rescue of persons, who are in danger of drowning, for example after a boat accident





Max and Flocke are thirsty

For the whole afternoon Flocke has been chasing throughout the house with Max. Now he is panting while he looks at Max. "You are thirsty, aren't you?", Max asks. "I'll fill up your bowl." Flocke gets up happily, barking and running around Max. "Just a second", he says to calm him and turns up the water-tap. Hey, where is the water? Not a single droplet comes out.
